I said that I am due to retire in May so why don't I do a sponsored walk. Without thinking it through, I thought I could do the Pennine way but sadly the public rights of way were closed. So thinking cap on, where to go? I decided to walk the CAMINO DE SANTIAGO, 500 miles from France to Spain. Once I had decided to go off and do it the band were very pleased so the weekend of my retirement they came and sat in the garden and played to send me off on my journey. They also gave me a T shirt which they had all signed along with Stiperstones Brass written on it and with some brass band logos. Off I went by train to the start in St Jean and then on by foot towards Santiago. It took me 26 days and then I went and stayed with my nephew in Madrid to recover.

Since that life changing trek, I am still in contact with some of the other pilgrims I met on route and since then I have been out to Spain on a number of occasions looking after refugios and hostals and of course pilgrims.

## GARDEN SALE TRAIL

Plans for the villages "garden sale trail" on Sunday 13th June are underway. We are expecting at least 18 households to participate. The Snailbeach trail will take you from the village hall around Lower works towards the smelt house and then a lovely woodland walk to Upper works where visitors can take a detour to the pool and mines site. The trail will then head up the main road towards Stiperstones, with another house near Snailbeach chapel before hitting Stiperstones itself. The Stiperstones stalls are up Perkins Beach dingle and the main road before the trail takes you up to Pennerley where we have another three houses along a quiet country track. There are lovely walks and picnic spots for those wanting to go off the beaten track and of course the pub and shop at Stiperstones. # SHROPSHIRE HILLS SHUTTLE BUSES 2021

Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> July – Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> September  
weekends & August Bank Holiday Monday

The Shropshire Hills Shuttle Buses will be back on the road this summer taking passengers onto the Long Mynd, and across to the Stiperstones, helping them to explore and enjoy this beautiful part of the Shropshire Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

Change to the route – now turning at Stiperstones village

Regular Shuttle Bus passengers please note a change to the route. The Buses start at Carding Mill Valley and call at the Beaumont Road bus stop in Church Stretton, before heading up the Burway onto the Long Mynd. From Bridges, they travel to the Stiperstones National Nature Reserve, and onto the Bog Visitor Centre and Stiperstones village. Here, the buses will turn and head back along the same route to Bridges. At Bridges, the buses head back to Church Stretton and Carding Mill Valley via Duckley Nap and Jinly, the northern end of the Long Mynd.

Support

We hope these changes will make the Shuttle service financially sustainable for future years. The simple thing you can do to support the service is to use it, share your experiences and encourage your friends and family on board. You can also donate through our Shuttle Bus Supporter Scheme and help with passenger research and promotion.

Tickets

You purchase your ticket from the driver as you board the bus. We also offer a season ticket to buy in advance which gives you free travel on the Shuttle Buses. Concessionary bus passes are also accepted, and well-behaved dogs can travel with their owner at the driver's discretion.

Further information

The Shuttles will run from Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> July, every weekend & August Bank Holiday Monday to Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> September. The buses are managed by the Shropshire Hills AONB Partnership, supported by Shropshire Council and operated by local bus company Boulton's. A surprising number of features central to the British political system are nothing more than convention. There is no constitutional requirement for there to be a Prime Minister for example, it is simply a role that has developed over time.

## Philip Dunne MP's latest Letter from Westminster

Following the move to Step 3 of the recovery roadmap last month, we have all been able to enjoy some of the freedoms that mean so much to us all.



The ability once again to hug family and friends, and overnight stays possible across the country, have given the opportunity to reunite with loved ones in a way not possible for months. For those in care homes across South Shropshire, loosening the rules to allow five visitors, instead of just two previously, has meant a great deal.

For many people, the chance to get out and make the most of South Shropshire's great food and drink venues, without the need to run the gauntlet with the Great British weather, has been a great pleasure. Like many others, I took the opportunity to eat out and support a local pub once restrictions changed to allow indoor dining on 17th May, and encourage others to support their favourite local pubs and restaurants now we are able. It is especially important to help them bounce back after such a tough year.

In a welcome boost to South Shropshire's vital tourism trade, hostels, hotels, and B&Bs have been able to welcome back guests. Schools can once again organise trips with overnight stays - crucial to support many of the outdoor leisure businesses in South Shropshire, which rely on residential visits.

Later in the month, all being well, we will move to Step 4 - the final marker on the roadmap. I write before full clarity has been issued about what this mean in terms of any need for continued distancing or certification, but we do know that the government hopes to be in a position to remove all legal limits on social contact. But this will depend on other factors, like the successful pilots of largescale events with crowds.

The fact that we are able to move encouragingly, and hopefully irreversibly, towards resumption of normal freedoms we enjoyed pre-pandemic is thanks to two factors: the continued respect for the rules by the public, and the remarkable success of the vaccine rollout. The UK has been consistently at the top of world league tables for our vaccine doses administered, helping to keep our population safe. But sadly, risks remain, as we have seen from the advance of new, more contagious or more deadly variants in other parts of the world. So we cannot throw caution to the wind just yet.

We must continue to consider the vulnerability of those we contact, and obviously watch how variants of the virus spread, and maintain social distance when not with friends and family. Remember hands, face, space and fresh air.

As we approach the longest day of the year - the marker for the change to Step 4 - I hope we are able to put this most difficult period behind us, and move towards the return to normal freedoms we all need, and deserve.



## Pontesbury Gardeners' Association

As gardeners we're never happy with the weather: it's too hot or too cold, too wet or too dry, and this year it's been everything - all at once on some days. Some plants have been slow to get going, but now that we are

heading to mid-summer we can take a more positive attitude: the seed potatoes that were planted in April will be showing good growth and a strawberry crop isn't far away. In the flower border many of the taller annuals and perennials will need support to stop them all flopping over onto one-another; it's best to do this before they are too big - let them grow into their supports, and hide them as they grow.

If you've been participating in no-mow-May you can now get the mower out and tidy up the grass; don't take too much off at once though as the lawn will then look scalped and suffer in any dry spell. It's best to leave the grass an inch or so to keep it healthy. Lawn clippings are very good to add to your compost bin, but if you have allowed weeds to grow among the grass, or the grass seed-heads to develop, then it's best not to add these seeds to the compost as domestic compost heaps rarely get hot enough to kill off weed seeds.

The increased interest in gardening during the lockdowns has increased the demand for potting compost. We have another bulk load on order but delivery may take a while. The reduction of peat use has meant that other materials have had to be sourced, and increased demand combined with a shortage of these raw materials has created the shortage. In the meantime we are taking delivery from an alternative supplier so we should have a good supply of everything needed in the garden..

There is no fixed amount of time between elections. The law states that a government must have an election at least every five years, but an election can be called at any point within that time. The Queen has ultimate power over the dissolution of Parliament, but convention allows the Prime Minister to choose when this should be. When the PM decides the time is right to have an election, they contact the Queen and ask her to dissolve Parliament. This often proves advantageous to the Government who usually wait until they are ahead in popularity before putting the vote to the public.



## John Muir: The man behind the beard. 1838-1914

With a beard to compete with today's hipsters, John Muir was an adventurer and explorer, botanist and inventor. He was born in Scotland but aged 11 he emigrated with his family to north America. He is famed as a founding father of the conservation movement and was

instrumental in the creation of Yosemite National Park, one of the first National Parks. Muir devoted his life to safeguarding the world's natural landscapes, so his message is as relevant now as it was then - he'd surely be best buddies with David Attenborough if he were alive today!

He was passionate that everybody should be able to experience, enjoy and care for wild places, and become active conservationists, campaigners, practical project workers, scientists, writers and artists.

Muir's legacy lives on in and is celebrated through the John Muir Award. Each year thousands of young people achieve the Award by discovering and exploring wild places, by taking part in active conservation, and by sharing their experience with others. The John Muir Award forms the centrepiece of a new Young Rangers project right here in the Shropshire Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, offering young people aged 12-16 opportunities for hands-on conservation, teamwork and personal development.


Last month I, all too hastily, mentioned that winter might be ending, and since then we have seen one of the coldest and bleakest starts to a year with snow showers well into May. Hopefully I can now be safe in saying that the hill should be emerging, at long last, from winters grasp. The cold weather has held back a lot of normal wildlife activity and has particularly affected the common gorse bushes, which have seen a lot of die back across the country. The bushes are now flowering but a lot of the foliage has turned brown.



Nesting birds are certainly later this year and some of the blue tits in nest boxes that we monitor had a full clutch of eggs for a couple of weeks before the adults finally started to incubate them. Migrant birds such as wheatear, redstarts and pied flycatchers were late returning and then all seem to arrive at once over one weekend, with a handful of ring ouzels passing through. Ring ouzels used to breed in the Shropshire Hills, but unfortunately the last pair nested on the Long Mynd in 2006 and they are now extinct in Shropshire as a breeding bird. A particular shame, as their song varies from area to area, so the Shropshire ring ouzel dialect has now gone forever.

On a brighter note I was surveying for breeding snipe along the east side of the hill this spring and the first visit had five displaying males “drumming” over the wetter areas of the slope, some on and some just off the nature reserve. Hearing snipe display on a still evening is one of the most magical sounds to be heard in the countryside. The strange pulsating, whirring noise is produced as the male birds fly sharply downwards. It is at this point that their outer tail feathers vibrate and create this odd otherworldly sound. The female birds below could be heard responding from the rushes, with little “chit-chit” calls. Considering that the Shropshire survey in 2014 only recorded 5 pairs across the county and in 2019 10 pairs this is a great result and hopefully evidence of the benefits of some of our re-wetting work on this side of the hill.

As summer warms the ground, common lizards emerge from their winter torpor and start basking in the sun. Like all reptiles they are cold-blooded and so are quite sluggish until they warm up. One of the best places to see these creatures is along the access-for-all trail from the Knolls car park, where they can often be seen on the rail next to the path. However, there is a good chance they can be seen on any south facing bank on the heath. They are known as the viviparous lizard, which means that they bear live young, the eggs being incubated within the body, an adaptation that allows them to live in cool places.

## A TALE OF TWO KITTIES

### CHAPTER 7: GATOS EN ESPANA – CATS IN SPAIN

Myself and my three kitties arrived at Madrid airport and an hour later, after vet checks, we were on our way in a hire car to Andalucia and home. The Madrid spaghetti junction is always a nightmare to me but I managed to get onto the southbound carriageway. As I was unfamiliar with the names of the districts surrounding



Madrid it took an hour and a half before I realised I was heading west instead of south. Somewhere I had missed the turn off to the south as the road had curved west. It was a shock to see Cordoba and Seville on the overhead signs. It took a while to find a place to turn off the motorway and return to the southbound road. A journey which normally takes 5 hours took 8 hours and this after a 9 hour flight and 3 hours hanging around airports. To say I was tired is being polite.

We arrived at my home which had been beautifully renovated over the previous few months before my return. I now had a balcony and French windows in my bedroom, looking towards the mountains, reservoir and fabulous sunsets. This had been the hay loft with a small hatch when I last saw it. I settled down with a snack and well earned glass of something strong to drink. The kitties explored their new home.

After a wonderful night's sleep and leisurely breakfast I started unpacking and thinking about my new life. It was strange realising that I didn't have to do everything urgently before my next flight out to some far flung destination. I was 'retired', I had no job to go to, I was a lady of leisure, yippee. While I was enjoying these reveries I had a phone call. It was my eldest son who lived further North in Spain but frequently stayed with me on business trips further south. He asked me if I had a black and white cat, I now had two. There was a moment's silence. He then told me a friend of his had passed my house early that morning and there was a dead cat on the road. It was Shaggy. Poor kittie had obviously got confused in the dark and ended up on the road. I had assumed he was curled up asleep in the house somewhere. So sad, after such a tragic life I had hoped he would enjoy his life of freedom in Spain.

Tom Bombadil and Goldberry seemed to remember that they had been here before and settled down quickly. Tom Bombadil would sit in the long grass of the rambla opposite my house, waiting to pounce on small furry creatures. I would see his head sticking out above the grass and when he saw my car coming up the road he would saunter across to the house. I was always amazed at his luck because the Spanish drivers would never stop for a cat on the road and Tom Bombadil would never hurry.

Goldberry would hunt and bring in live mice, voles and other small beasts. She would drop them proudly at my feet. They would swiftly scurry off trying to hide while I frantically attempted to rescue them and put them outside. Tom Bombadil was usually snoozing but would suddenly wake up and deftly pounce, catching the unfortunate creature. He would then growl at us daring us to try and take it off him, stupid animal, as if we wanted it. I would then reluctantly have to open the door to let him out where he would dispose of his catch.



Fortunately they resisted catching the occasional scorpion or snake who ventured into the house.

During the heat of the summer we stayed indoors, temperatures reached over 40 C degrees. This was the desert region of Spain after all. Each year everybody hoped the summer wouldn't start too soon. The end of April was always a risky time. One day it would be a very pleasant warm temperature and overnight the heat would hit and last until the end of October. My house had thick stone walls and was cool inside. The kitties appreciated the tiled floors throughout. It was such a relief to get home after a morning in the weekly market. Normally we wouldn't venture out before six in the evening when it was relatively cool. However the beaches gave some relief a couple of times a week with cool breezes and sea bathing.

I had land around my house and a courtyard between the kitchen and studio. This offered privacy for sunbathing in the morning, I painted it in Mediterranean colours and had a wall of hanging painted plant pots. The pots overflowed with magnificent geraniums which reminded me of my trips to the patios and courtyards of Cordoba.



There were angry scenes at the 2010 election when some people were still queuing outside when the polls closed at 10pm. It would be difficult to imagine that happening in the 18th century, when polling might typically go on for a week or more, to allow voters from outlying areas to travel in to cast their vote.

In the pre-telecommunications age, there was no need for elections to take place at the same time, and there was often a staggered start to the voting process across the country. In fact, elections were not all held on the same day until 1918.



## ***Curlew Cam 2021***

Coming soon to a screen near you

Wednesday the 12th of May 2021 sees the return of the much loved Curlew Cam for its fifth year. The live nest camera will be streaming from 10am, offering a wonderful glimpse into the nesting habits of these secretive birds. The camera is brought to us by Curlew Country, an organisation that works closely with farmers and land managers in the Shropshire Hills and Welsh borders.



Curlew Cam first hit the ground in 2017. Set up by Curlew Country, a conservation organisation fighting to help severely threatened Curlew in the dramatic backdrop of the Shropshire Hills and Welsh borders. The hidden camera gives incredible glimpses into Curlew nesting; showing the innermost moments that could not be seen in such detail any other way. Curlews are incredibly secretive birds, especially when nesting, and watching them on Curlew Cam is a unique chance for enthusiasts and professionals alike to view something impossible to see otherwise.

Curlew Cam has been watched enthusiastically by a wide audience from the UK and overseas, really capturing their hearts and drawing them into the secret start-to-life of young Curlew. From the dedicated incubation of those beautiful, speckled eggs, through the intimate moments of hatching to the adorable, fluffy chicks wobbling around on their too long legs and plus size feet, clambering over their patient parents. Now, for the fifth year it is being set up and will be screening the much-anticipated moments, both wonderful and tense via the Curlew Country website, [www.curlewcountry.org](http://www.curlewcountry.org).

This year Curlew Country's Curlew Cam is sponsored by the newly formed Curlew Recovery Partnership (CRP). The recently established CRP brings together different organisations working in Curlew conservation. It aims to share information across England to those who need help with Curlew Recovery work and inspire others to become involved. To find out more at [www.curlewrecovery.org](http://www.curlewrecovery.org).

Curlew chicks are incredibly vulnerable, nesting on the ground they are threatened by predators, accidental agricultural activity too close to the nest, and disturbance. But in order to bolster the sharply declining UK population (by 50% in the UK in 25 years and 70% in Shropshire) it is imperative that more chicks fledge to keep the captivating calls of these birds floating over our farm and moorland in years to come. Curlew Country works in a regional stronghold for breeding Curlew, with roughly 40 pairs returning to attempt to breed here year after year. But with the pressures threatening them, they fail to fledge chicks in the wild. We are working hard with farming partners to turn this around and providing evidence to feed back to policy makers. Our wide community of Curlew supporters want to work toward a sustainable future for Curlew through achieving natural nest success.

The Curlew Cam nest is protected with an electric fence, but it is still 'touch and go' whether the eggs and chicks will make it or not. Keep an eye on them and watch their progress on Curlew Cam to see if this year will be a heart lifting success or a reminder of just why we are fighting so hard to protect these charismatic and vulnerable emblems of our springtime, vibrant meadows and wild uplands.

We are often told that Greece and particularly the state of Athens was the birth place of democracy, but there were few 'elections' where people voted for candidates in the Greek political system.

Instead the Ancient Greeks employed a system called '*Sortition*'

Sortition, or election by lot, was a method of choosing public officials in some ancient Greek city-states. It was used especially in the Athenian democracy, from which most information about the practice is derived. Those wishing to take office submitted their names, which went into a 'hat' and the successful candidates were drawn at random. With few exceptions, all magistrates were chosen by lot, beginning with the archons in 487–486 bc; likewise the Boule (council) of 500 and the juries of the law courts were chosen by lot. The practice of sortition meant no candidates could gain favour by promoting themselves, spreading false rumours about other candidates, putting friends and colleagues under pressure to vote for them or even using bribery but still provided for a regular turnover of officeholders. The operations of government were thus not in the hands of self assertive 'experts', but, through the system of sortition, the Athenian democracy was not just the voice of the people but the actions of the people.

The rationale of sortition was the equality of all citizens. Only those who had presented themselves as candidates were chosen by lot to fill public offices. Military officers (including the 10 stratēgoi) and some financial officials were selected by voting rather than by sortition. But for the most part executive functions were broken down into small tasks, of which each was entrusted to an annual board of 10 members chosen by lot.

It is exactly 10 years since we had a referendum about the way we vote - do you remember?

on 5th May 2011 we were asked

"At present, the UK uses the "first past the post" system to elect MPs to the House of Commons. Should the "alternative vote" system be used instead?"

The "Alternative Vote" system on offer was this.

In elections held under the Alternative Vote, each voter may rank candidates on the ballot paper in order of preference (1, 2, 3 etc.). For this reason, the Alternative Vote is known as a "preferential" voting system. After marking their first preference, voters may then choose to express further preferences for as many, or as few, candidates as they wish. The count begins by allocating votes in line with first preferences. If a candidate has an "absolute majority" - more than 50% - of the votes after this allocation they are elected. If no candidate has an absolute majority, then the candidate in last place is eliminated and their votes are reallocated according to the next highest preference expressed on each ballot paper; if a voter has not marked a preference for any candidate that remains in the contest, then the ballot paper is set aside from the count. This process continues until a candidate has an absolute majority of the votes left in the count, and is elected.

Despite a strong campaign by the Lib Dems the nation voted by 134 million to 6 million to retain the old method.
